
YOUR IMPACT ...





IMPACT: UNDERGRADUATE EDUCATION

Thanks to generous donors like you, the Lambda Chi Alpha Educational Foundation has granted more than \$4 million in support of educational programming since 2008. Two of these initiatives are the High Alpha Summit and Neville Advisor's College, which were combined for the first time in 2019.

The joint event achieved record-shattering attendance. Though it was a daunting task, holding concurrent conferences provides clear advantages. Alumni attending Neville Advisor's College (many of them High Pis) have a direct impact on chapters and colonies. So, who better to pair them with than chapter presidents? Together, these Lambda Chi leaders become even more strongly positioned to better each other through shared experiences and best practices.

"This curriculum provides us a greater opportunity to be teachers and mentors, versus a more passive approach," said Brian Bodine, Alumni Advisory Board member for North Texas University and Tarleton State University and Neville facilitator.

"To be around almost 200 other High Alphas, seeing how they do things and getting more insight, have a lot more to bring back to my guys back home," noted Bradley Jenkins, William & Mary High Alpha. Jenkins affirmed that his new connections and wealth of knowledge would make all the difference back at the chapter. "No matter what you do on paper, the impact you leave on your brothers and the way they feel supported by you as High Alpha are what really create your legacy in that position."

Brandan Bonds, Special Assistant to the CEO, has attended each High Alpha Summit since its beginning in 2015. He affirms that the caliber of chapter/colony presidents has gotten better and better over the years. Now with the introduction of a joint conference, Bonds, along with the rest of IHQ staff, is confident that Lambda Chi members will benefit for years to come.

IMPACT: **ALUMNI ADVISING**

Pride ... alumni of Epsilon-Alpha Zeta at The College of William & Mary have a lot of it.

Their extraordinary determination to revive their chapter is a premier demonstration of that pride. The 11 men on the chapter's advisory board, most of whom graduated in the 1970s, continue to meet regularly, despite being spread out all over the U.S. "The bond that has persisted all of these years is still there," Alumnus and Advisory Board Member Tom Wilke said. "Like it is with real siblings, we can pick up and not miss a beat from the last time we were talking."

Even their chapter having lost its charter and house five years ago hasn't dampened their loyalty. To keep the alumni spirit alive, they continue to host a "No House, No Problem" tent party during homecoming!

"We want alumni to stay connected, and we're seeing more and more momentum in that effort," alumnus and Advisory Board Member Gary Powers said.

Throughout the chapter's five-year absence, they have continued to raise funds for the recolonization effort. In 2018, all but two of the advisory board members attended the Neville Advisor's College.

"We wanted to reacquaint ourselves with the current philosophy of Greek life," Wilke said. "... to prepare ourselves in whatever way we could. I don't think any of us realized the vast knowledge we would acquire by attending, which will provide us invaluable guidance in the months ahead."

The College put a spotlight on recent changes in Greek life and introduced alumni advisors to new ways of doing things. "We've been out of this realm for 45 years now, so it really opened our eyes," Wilke continued. "It was just awesome. Every one of us was very impressed."

"Neville helped us feel like we have really hit the ground running," Powers said. "Lambda Chi means a lot to every one of us. Having that lifelong bond is amazing, so we want to make sure that accomplished brothers are here to help new members through the process."

Thanks to Educational Foundation donors, a \$60,000 annual grant funds the Neville Advisor's College — a three-day training conference for chapter advisors, house corporation officers, and alumni association leaders. More than 400 alumni volunteers have benefited since 2014.
